STOP 1: V&A WATERFRONT

5 Nights | 2 Rounds of Golf

They say there's never a bad time to visit Cape Town! Widely known as one of the most interesting and vibrant cities in the world, the World Design Capital of 2014 is a heady cocktail of modern culture, fascinating history and exceptional natural beauty. Situated between Robben Island and Table Mountain in the heart of Cape Town's working harbour, the ancient Victoria & Alfred Waterfront is South Africa's most visited tourist destination that also serves as an ideal departure point for tours in and around Cape Town. Here Cape Dutch architecture and 21st century skyscrapers jostle for space with 450+ retail outlets that sell everything from high-street international fashion to indigenous local jewelry. And if shopping works up an appetite, over 80 eateries present culinary delights from rustic al fresco fish and chips to starched table-cloth fine dining in settings ranging from the water's edge to feeling the sand under your feet. Add 22 heritage landmarks, indoor entertainment venues, live performances, and countless air, land and water activities; and we dare you to ever get bored at the nerve center of Cape Town.

Day 1: Arrival Day

- Spend the rest of the day at leisure.
- Overnight at the Table Bay Hotel.

Day 3: Cape Peninsula Tour

- After breakfast you will be collected for a Full Day Cape Point & Peninsula .
- Overnight at the Table Bay Hotel.

Day 4: Round of Golf at Royal Cape Golf Course

- After breakfast you are off to play 1 x 18 Holes golf at Royal Cape Golf Course, Wynberg (Includes Green Fee).
- Spend the rest of the day at leisure.

Day 5: Robben Island

STOP 2: MOSSEL BAY

2 Nights | 1 Rounds of Golf

Overlooking an expansive bay from the sunwashed shores of Cape St. Blaize, the picture-perfect town of Mossel Bay is an essential stop along the Garden Route, with a tradition of unhurried hospitality and sufficient natural beauty. The blueblack backdrop of the Outeniqua Mountains stunningly complements the long stretch of beaches. Having featured in the Guinness Book of Records as having the mildest all-year climate in the world, second only to Hawaii, Mossel Bay's an ideal summer, and winter, retreat. Lose yourself in the town's rich and significant history with visits to iconic landmarks such as the century-old stone homes built by Cornish stonemasons. Get intrigued by South Africa's very first post office in this quaint town, which originated in 1500, when a man named Pedro de Ataide left a letter in a shoe under a milkwood tree. Join the crowd and experience the adrenaline-packed way of life in Mossel Bay with whale and seal watching and water sports like scuba diving. The wide beaches and awe-inspiring cliffs provide a welcome so memorable you'll never forget your tour of the Garden Route.

Day 6: Round of Golf at Pinnacle Point

- After breakfast check out of the Table Bay Hotel and self drive to Gondwana Game Reserve. En route stop to play 1 x 18 Holes golf at Pinnacle Point Golf Course, Mossel Bay (Includes Green Fee).
- Enjoy a late afternoon game drive.
- Overnight at the Gondwana Game Reserve.

Day 7: Gondwana Game Reserve

- Today is an early start as you enjoy a morning game drive followed by breakfast. Spend the rest of the day at leisure and enjoy a late afternoon game drive.

STOP 3: GEORGE

5 Nights | 2 Rounds of Golf

Nestled below the Outeniqua Mountains, at the heart of South Africa's coastal paradise, Garden Route and halfway between Cape Town and Port Elizabeth, sits the sixth oldest town of South Africa. This pretty village is George which was originally a woodcutters post for the Dutch East India Company, and was later renamed after King George III during the British occupation of the Cape. Of historical interests in George is the Slave Tree - an ancient oak to which slaves were chained before they were auctioned to the highest bidder. A length of chain and padlock are still embedded in its trunk. George also has the largest collection of steam trains at the Railway Museum, while the Church of St Peter and St Paul is the oldest Roman Catholic Church in South Africa. George is the perfect base to explore several nearby attractions like game safari, wine estates, village markets and golf apart from a host of outdoor activities like paragliding, hang-gliding, hiking, canoeing and sailing. Interestingly, George is the only district in the country that grows hops and supplies most of the country's beer-brewing needs.

Day 8: Fancourt Hotel

- After your Morning Game Drive and Breakfast check out of Gondwana Game Reserve and self drive to Fancourt Hotel. Check in for your 5 night stay.
- Spend the rest of the day at leisure.
- Overnight at the Fancourt Hotel.

Day 9: Round of Golf at Fancourt Montagu Golf Course

- After breakfast set off to play 1 x 18 Holes golf at Fancourt Montagu Golf Course, George (Includes Green Fee).
- Spend the rest of the day at leisure.
- Overnight at the Fancourt Hotel.

Day 10: Day at Leisure

- Spend the day at leisure exploring the surrounding areas.
- Overnight at the Fancourt Hotel.

Day 11: Round of Golf at Fancourt Outeniqua

- After breakfast set off to play 1 x 18 Holes golf at Fancourt Outeniqua Golf Course, George (Includes Green Fee).
- Spend the rest of the day at leisure.
- Overnight at the Fancourt Hotel.

Day 12: Day at Leisure

- Spend the day at leisure.
- Overnight at the Fancourt Hotel.

Day 13: Departure Day

- Enjoy breakfast before checking out of the Fancourt Hotel and self drive to the airport for your flight back home.

Inaugurated by Nelson Mandela in May 1997, the Table Bay Hotel straddles the historic Alfred Harbor and effortlessly combines Victorian elegance with contemporary modernity.

Each of the 329 luxury rooms and suites overlook either the Robben Island or the Table Mountain and features spacious walk-in closets, marble finishes, writing desks and twice daily turn down service. Bathrooms have vanity make-up mirrors, separate baths and showers, range of international cosmetics and Mediterranean-style bathrobes and slippers.

The Atlantic Grill and the Conservatory Restaurant spoil guests with unlimited choices, while the Union Bar's wine cellar stocks over 6000 varieties, apart from the signature Table Bay Rose cocktail and exclusively brewed Oscar Lager beer.



 GONDWANA GAME RESERVE ★★★★★
 Mossel Bay, Garden Route

Set on 11,000-hectares of undulating valleys and indigenous Fynbos, the Gondwana Game Reserve is the first authentic free-roaming Big Five reserve in the Western Cape, and home to several endangered wild species including Cape Mountain Zebra, Black Rhinoceros, and Black Harrier.

Accommodation at Gondwana ranges from open-plan suites in Kwena Lodge, a clever twist on traditional Khoi-San dwelling; to spacious Afro chic Fynbos and Bush Villas with choices of 2, 3 and 4 en-suite bedrooms. Guests are treated to surprise bush breakfasts, afternoon romantic picnics, evening barbecues and sundowners at scenic spots.

The Kwena and Lehele Restaurants serve authentic South African cuisine in outdoor or boma style, while the spa offers natural pen-air treatments with Africology products.

🚩 CLOVELLY

📍 Fish Hoek, Cape Town

👤 Par 72 | Hole 18 | 5893 m

Nestled in the tranquil Silvermine Valley between Fish Hoek and Kalk Bay, the Clovelly Country Club rewards accuracy off the tee and provides players with scenic views of the False Bay coastline. Known for its year round conditioning, the relatively short course possesses a unique character by virtue of its proximity to the sea. The dune lined fairways lead to excellent bent grass and poa annua greens; while the many trees create shelter from the strong summer sea breeze.

The rolling computer-irrigated fairways complement visually pleasing water features, which impact the 1st, 10th, 15th and 17th holes. The signature hole is the 4th, a par-4 with out-of-bounds and a stream on the left, and a green guarded by a water hazard. The clubhouse presents a high vantage point not only of the 18th hole, but also the 1st and 10th which both feature sharp doglegs, to the right and left respectively.



🚩 ROYAL CAPE

📍 Wynberg, Cape Town

👤 Par 72 | Hole 18 | 5797 m

Royal Cape Golf Club is a true championship course having hosted the South African Open and the SA Amateur Championships multiple times. The course has undergone extensive work to match the USGA standards and is now a fine test of golf and worthy of its championship rating. South Africa's oldest golf club emanates a rich history and tradition. Improvements to the single-storey clubhouse have enhanced that sense of tradition, which is innovatively combined with the requirements of today's golfer. There is also the added attraction of a good practice range near the clubhouse, and three practice nets. With lovely views of Table Mountain from most holes this championship course offers a beautiful setting that will make your visit here truly memorable.

The course is a very flat parkland course in essence, well maintained and a sure delight to play on with stunning mountain views. The narrow fairways demand extreme accuracy off the tee, wayward shots can be heavily penalized amongst the trees and the greens are well bunkered. There is also plenty of water on the course, especially at the corner of the 3rd, 4th, 5th and also the 14th, 15th and 16th. The most difficult holes are the par-4 3rd and the par-4 14th. The second nine offers quite a challenge for the average golfer: two challenging par 3s and a very magnificent par 4! The locals do not call it their own 'Amen' corner for nothing!



🚩 PINNACLE POINT

📍 Mossel Bay, Garden Route

👤 Par 72 | Hole 18 | 6465 m

The Pinnacle Point Golf Course, co-designed by renowned golf architect Peter Matkovich and professional golfer Darren Clarke, stretches along four kilometres of spectacular coastline and boasts dramatic cliff-side holes as well as a virgin beachfront. Awe inspiring views are a given with the stunning ocean visible from every hole.

The emerald green fairways and tees offer a perfect surface for making shots and the bent grass greens will ensure a challenging and entertaining game. The seven holes perched precariously along the cliff edge not only intimidate but also seduce the golfer with both their challenges and their beauty, and are justifiably some of the world's most photographed holes.

🚩 FANCOURT MONTAGU

📍 George, Garden Route

👤 Par 72 | Hole 18 | 6714 m

Voted the number one golf course in South Africa in 2000, the Montagu Golf Course at Fancourt is named after the mountain pass of the same name, and is part of the original 27-hole design at Fancourt by the legendary Gary Player in the early 90s. This classic tree-lined parklands layout underwent a major facelift in 2005 under renowned Scottish golf architect David McLay Kidd.

The upgrade saw two completely new holes - the 1st and the 9th., redefined bunkers and greens and introduction of several water features such as the dam. Celebrated for its immaculate, round the year conditioning, the Montagu GC is currently ranked at #6 in South Africa (Golf Digest, 2014). The signature hole is the Par-3 17th, reminiscent of the 12th hole at Augusta National - the permanent home of the US Masters.



🚩 FANCOURT OUTENIQUA

📍 George, Garden Route

👤 Par 72 | Hole 0 | 6312 m

A majestic 18-hole parkland layout at Fancourt, designed by the legendary Grand Slam golfer Gary Player, the Outeniqua is quite similar to the Montagu and offers challenging design and fine conditioning to ensure an excellent test for all levels of golfers. With play being restricted to hotel residents, members and their guests, the course rarely seems crowded and you can enjoy a peaceful and comfortable round of golf at your pace. Although set in the same surroundings as its better known counterparts, the Outeniqua has developed an individual personality rivalling the others.

As with all courses at Fancourt, there are a variety of tees from which to choose to play, ensuring that golfers are unlikely to ever feel overpowered by the course. Excellent water features and creeks interspersed with uphill and downhill challenges and excellent bunkering (recently renovated) are all augmented in the charm and challenge by the colourful flora to be seen throughout the course.
